'**There**' is a church over the road. "Where is the church?" "It's over **there!**"

'**Their**' is a possessive pronoun meaning 'belonging to them' -

Their car is red.

The children hung **their** coats up on **their** pegs.

'**They're**' is a contraction of '**they are**' -

After school, **they're** going to play football.

They're getting married on Saturday.

'**Who's**' is a contraction of '**who is**' or '**who has**' -

"**Who's** taken my pink pen?"

"**Who's** going to the park later?"

'**Whose**' is the possessive form of the pronoun 'who' and it means 'belonging to someone' -

"**Whose** jacket is that?"

The robber, **whose** mask had slipped, fled the scene.

"**Whose** team are you on?"

'**Your**' is a possessive determiner, meaning 'something belongs to you or the person you are speaking to' -

"What is **your** name?"

"Are these **your** car keys?"

'**You're**' is a contraction of '**you are**' -

"Look where **you're** going!"

"**You're** not doing that right."

'**He'll**' is a contraction of '**he will**' or '**he shall**' -

He'll finish doing his homework tomorrow.

He'll be the one wearing the football scarf.

I trained my dog to walk to **heel**.

She was told her broken arm would **heal** in a few weeks.

"I have a blister on my **heel** from these new running shoes, I hope it **heals** soon!"
